

TOWN OF FAYETTE
SEPTEMBER 13TH, 2018
BOARD MEETING

The Fayette Town Board Meeting was called to order by Supervisor Lorenzetti at 7PM with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag and a moment of Silence in remembrance of 9/11.

PRESENT: Supervisor Lorenzetti, Councilwoman Zwick, Councilmen Goff and Trout, Town Attorney Ricci of Midey, Mirras & Ricci, and Town Clerk Murray.

ABSENT: Councilwoman Lowry.

OTHERS PRESENT: S.Hensel, J. Brignall, J. Christensen, J. McCormick, B.Steele, J. Cleere, C. Brady, G.Lynn, D. Buck, R. Conley.

PRIVELDGE OF THE FLOOR: R.Conley- Has received a water rate increase letter and is questioning the hike. Councilman Trout responded that because the county, Varick and the Village of Waterloo have increased the rates, the Town of Fayette must increase their rates also. G.Lynn- concerned about the 7 rental properties on Edgewood drive, stated that the rentals do not recycle, he has picked up lots of broken glass and has seen hot tub chemicals emptied into the lake. Attorney Ricci suggested he get a hold of the Army Core of Engineers. D.Buck- expressed interest in the Vacation Rental Inspector position. Councilwoman Zwick responded that the planning board is still working out all the details and all interest should be directed to Bob Steele.

DOG CONTROL OFFICER: ABSENT

CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICER: Bob Steele- 11 approved permits and 1 denied for the past month. Has received 5 letters of interest on the Vacation Rental Inspector position, and will be following through with the planning board.

TOWN ASSESSOR: Jim Cleere- had one court case out of the revaluation, which has been resolved out of court. The schools Tax Bills are out.

TOWN HISTORIAN: ABSENT

TOWN ENGINEER: Jason McCormick- finally heard from the DOT Region 5 office, we must make some changes to plans as laws have changed, shouldn't be too bad and hopefully will be timely. Working with Councilman Trout on the Leader Road fill station. Has been researching wash boarding as it relates to Post Road and has drafted a letter to the county. Supervisor Lorenzetti suggested that he meet with the highway Superintendent at least once monthly.

HIGHWAY SUPERINTENTENT: ABSENT Councilman Goff gave report. Williamson, Murray, Townline, Hoster, Canoga Spur, and Leader Roads have been Chipped sealed. Stacey and Marshall Roads have been chipped over pavement. Sweets Hill Road was ditched and rolled. Fall Clean Up will be October 13th, 2018 from 8AM -3PM.

TOWN CLERK: Nancy Murray- Last month we took in \$1670.00.

Steve Barto from the ZBA has been asked to attend. A joint meeting will be held on 10/11 at 6PM. A press release will be going on the website to assist residents with information.

OLD/NEW BUSINESS- Rick Conley suggests we keep track of mileage, overtime, gas, equipment used in Lodi to help during the flood as FEMA should reimburse.
-Councilwoman Zwick and Councilman Trout gave an update about the Historical society; they have spoken with John Hubbard from Interlaken who is a mason. He is interested in assisting with the manpower to restore the upstairs in the building.
Supervisor Lorenzetti- wanted to recognize Jim Bromka. Recently there was a article in the paper honoring Jim with a founders award by Seneca Lake Clear Lake. He was honored for his years of dedication and service.
