

**FAYETTE TOWN BOARD MEETING
MAY 13TH, 2021**

Present; Supervisor Lorenzetti, Councilmen Goff and Trout, Councilwomen Lowry and Zwick, Attorney Ricci and Clerk Murray

Supervisor Lorenzetti opened the meeting at 7 PM with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Privilege of the floor: Mark Benjamin from Seneca Meadows land fill with an update on what is going on at the Landfill this year. Slope filling operations, odor control, renewable natural gas, and ongoing application with the NYDEC.

Code Enforcement Officer Report: Bob Steele, 4 approved permits, 2 denied. 1 Vacation rental renewal was inspected. 1 violation complaint has been addressed.

Town Engineer Report: Jason McCormick, Meeting with Lyons Bank about financing water district number 8 project. Working on breaking project in to sections per Lyons bank, financing will be easier. Presented proposal for design/specifications/clerk of works not to exceed \$190,000.00. Per Town attorney, this should not be signed until we receive approval from the state comptroller. Short discussion on hiring two laborers to work temporarily to install full time.

Highway Superintendent Report: Andy Brown, Plow frames are off trucks. Oil/brake work is complete. Working on putting stone on some roads and ditching. Cindy Stephany should be out this week in reference to leak detection.

honoring Robert S. Duncanson in 2021 and 2022; and be it further

RESOLVED that the Town of Fayette Board supports the efforts to secure a

Historical Marker honoring Robert S. Duncanson; and be it further

RESOLVED that the Town of Fayette Board designates the year from June 1,

2021 to May 31, 2022 as the year honoring Robert S. Duncanson in the Town of Fayette, NY.
